EQUALISER IN THIRD MINUTE OF INJURY TIME DENIES ZOOKE'S XI OF TWO POINTS

Right from the kick off the pace was fast and the action complete. In the third minute Smith reaped the reward of all out effort. As their goalie slipped up and allowed the ball to slip out of his grasp Smith was there to bang the ball into the back of the net. Institute were 'getting stuck into' the game well and obviously upsetting the opposition. Eyo made a good save from a high ball and immediately followed this with a good save made possible by good positional play. Eyo was making his mark on this game by his encouragement to defenders and confident handling of the ball. Jamieson broke clear down the right flank but his long shot landed on top of the net.

After ten minutes Institute went further ahead. This was after great football. Ferrie put a great ball through to Jamieson who flicked it on into the danger area. Lee and Smith were both in the clear but it was Lee who got the final kick for goal number two. Lee now showed a fine turn of speed and left his marker yards behind. This was followed by a lovely flick on by Johnson that nearly led to goal number three. As Cardinal Allen fought back into the game our defence played their part in this performance. Mason played his side out of trouble with fine play and the ball was cleared upfield. Baker sent over a fine free kick and Johnson connected with a fine volley. However, Johnson saved his best football for the 20th minute. After breaking clear he showed great coolness by rounding the goalkeeper and slotting his shot into the net. This was a great goal and Institute looked to be in complete control.

As the half progressed Cardinal Allen began to make more use of the slope that was in their favour. A break away saw them reduce the arrears to 1-3.

This would have quickly become 2-3 if it had not been for Sillitoe who made a superb tackle at just the right moment. Sadly a right wing cross allowed another goal and the score stood at 2-3. Eyo had absolutely no chance with a fierce volley from 25 yards and now the scores were equal.

Eyo saved the team with a great save right at the beginning of the second half. Lee made a mistake just after and again Eyo saved the 'day'. Jamieson who had been instructed to move into the middle of the field began to assert his authority on the play. His performance was very vital to our progress in this second half. Ferrie was also getting really involved in play and prospects were looking good... Jamieson scored to make it 4-3 and Johnson had a great shot from an acute angle. Now it was Jamieson again who sent in a fierce rising shot. Baker also came close with a hard shot. The fifth goal came when Jamieson and Johnson broke clear to put the goalie under pressure. Doyle came on for Baker and immediately showed some fine touches in midfield.

Sadly in the last ten minutes we allowed Cardinal Allen too much room and time and they scored a fourth goal. Majek replaced Smith and filled the midfield gap that was noticeable in our play.

In the third minute of injury time misfortune struck Institute. Eyo came out to clear his line but his long kick struck Hassell and rebounded over his head into the goal. The final whistle followed immediately.

Thompson played well throughout the game and Hassell as usual stood firm in defence. Barry Lee had a quiet game for him but scored an important goal. Ferrie impressed with his continual action in midfield.

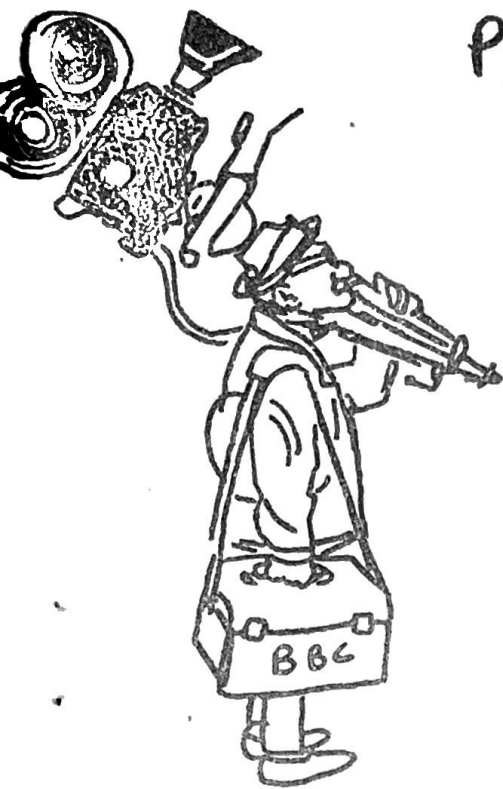

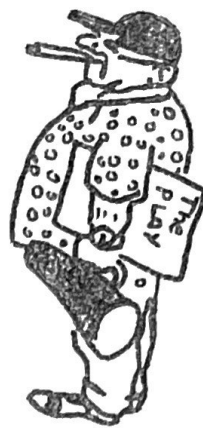
