This was going to be a difficult game against mainly sixth form opposition who have a record of many wins over the years. The game progressed fairly evenly and there was a lack of real incident in the play. De La Salle took the lead when one of their forwards scored a very clever goal by lobbing the ball over Galvins head into the net. However, he should never have been allowed to reach a scoring position. As De La Salle were kicking with a strong wind it was important to them that they should increase their lead. Turner made a vital clearance off the line and as the half concluded Institute could be well pleased with their performance. Eme had been his usual dominant self in midfield. Pereschine had again proved to be a real problem to the opposition defence. Phil Smith ran and chased everything and looked very impressive.

As the second half progressed Institute came more into the play. Eme had a clear chance but tried to lob the goalie instead of 'blasting' the ball. The chance went begging. But minutes later Institute scored a classic goal. Cousineau sent in a free kick and Peters met it with a perfect near post header that 'flashed' into the net.

PHIL SMITH ' POWERHOUSE BEHIND THE VICTORY. STEPHEN HARDING SCORES VITAL SECOND HALF GOAL.

The only game at Mersey Road. Mr Cooke and Mr. Day surveyed the results of their team selection the previous day. 10 players were all we could see and Mr Day suffering from an attack of flu departed as Zookie took up his whistle.

Institute were kicking with a strong wind behind them in the first half and it was important that they took a considerable lead, for it was inevitable that in the second half tired limbs and the difficulty of covering for the 'lost' player would take its toll.

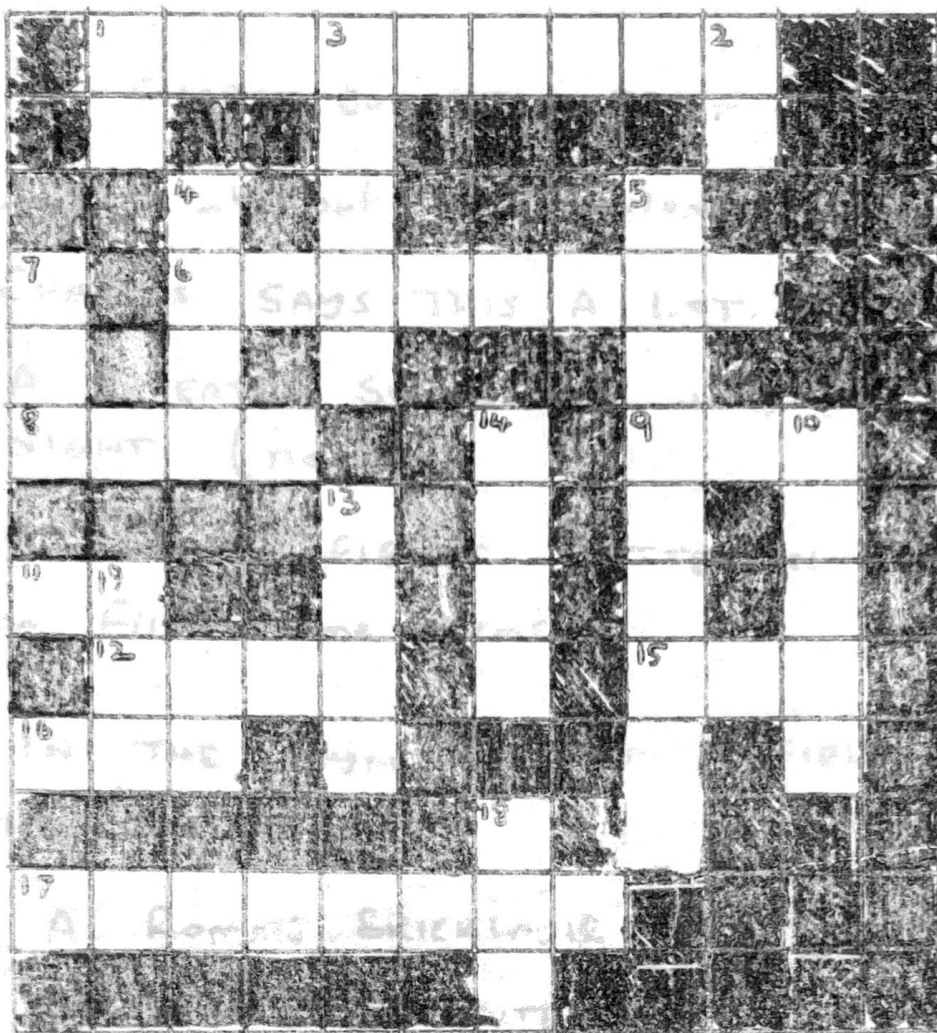
