SECOND HALF GOALS RESULT IN ANOTHER 5-1 WIN

After so much rain the pitch was in remarkably good condition, a credit to the groundstaff. Nevertheless it was obvious that difficulties would be met with a slippery ball and heavy surface.

The rain conveniently stopped just before kick off. Both sides took quite a long time to settle down and advantage was not taken of the loose ball. Along with an apparent lack of urgency there were few incidents in the first quarter of the game. Twice Hooper cleverly played himself out of a tight situation in defence and Freckleton made sure that the Halewood outside right had little room to manoeuvre. Half way through the first half the Halewood goalkeeper failed to hold a hard shot from Diable and after a scramble in the goalmouth Langford had the easiest of chances, tapping the ball home from 2 yards. Five minutes before half time Halewood were awarded a free kick and a hard shot eluded the entire defence and beat Chelley to equalise the score.

The second half began with Institute stepping up the pressure and after 5 minutes Langford broke clear to hit the ball under the goalkeepers body. This goal seemed to discourage Halewood for they no longer posed any danger to Institute. Half way through the second half a corner from the right was met by Diable at the near post and he confidently headed the ball into the corner of the goal. This was a very well taken goal and shortly afterwards Woods, cleverly reading the conditions, tried a long shot and scored from 25 yards, the ball sailing over the goalkeepers head. The opponents keeper made a fine save from Diable turning a very hard shot onto the crossbar thus denying Diable a much deserved second goal. Just before the end Warburton, playing much more up front, ran on to a long ball and beat the goalkeeper to make the score 5-1. Apart from one or two miskicks Johnson played well in defence and both full backs and Bennett who came on in the second half played safely and well. Again Woods put in a fine performance, having the satisfaction of scoring his first goal since the game at Manor High last season.
