PHILLIPSON OUTSTANDING IN DEFENCE AS INSTITUTE WIN 5-0 BY T. RUTLAND - FOOTBALL NEWS REPORTER AT HIGHFIELD

Highfield 0 Institute 5. Langford 3 Diable Warburton.

On a cold, rainy and windy evening Institute kicked off with the wind in their favour. In the early stages Hamilton came close to scoring from a short corner. Highfield threatened when their outside right ran down the wing and shot for goal. His shot went three yards wide. Neither side controlled the midfield in the early stages and it was Phillipson who made some very important tackles in to play his side out of danger. After ten minutes Highfield won a corner. The ball was crossed and a Highfield striker headed for goal from just inside the 6 yard box. Naughton showed why he is the A team goalkeeper, making a magnificent save. Diable came into the game with a fine shot. This resulted in a corner., Chellew sent over a low cross which was flicked on by Halewood. A goalmouth scramble resulted and Diable forced the ball over the line. A minute later Phillipson won the ball in midfield and beat one man before passing to Halewood. He pushed the ball on to Langford who chipped the ball over the goalkeepers head for a fine goal. This was Langford's long awaited fiftieth goal for Institute. Near the end of the first half Chellew moved down the wing and shot for goal. The goalkeeper made a brilliant save and from the resulting corner Halewood back headed the ball to Warburton who converted a fine goal. Johnson, despite a hard knock on the head was having a fine game and by half time Diable and Hassell had taken control of midfield. A half time score of 3-0 was very satisfying but with a strong wind to kick against Institute knew the game was far from over. Highfield came more into the game but the excellent tackling of Johnson, Hassell Chellew, O'shaughnessy and Phillipson and the expert keeping of Naughton kept Highfield at bay. Hamilton was having a fine game on the left wing and it was he who made the fourth goal, Langford's second. Hamilton beat two players, put a perfect pass into the path of Langford and he netted the goal that really finished off Highfield. The final goal was the finest football move of the whole game. Johnson won the ball in midfield and passed to Hamilton. The ball was moved on to Diable who in turn passed to Langford. It was Langford who completed the move and completed his hat trick. Langford looked very sharp and this was a return to his deadly scoring form of

earlier in the season. With about fifteen minutes to play an awkward bounce put Chellew under pressure. The ball bounced off his knee but the referee adjudged that he had handled the ball. A penalty was awarded but Highfield wasted it when the ball was blasted over the bar. Naughton pulled off some more fine saves and Warburton nearly scored his second goal when the ball was crossed to him by Hassell. Warburton's header hit the crossbar and Highfield cleared. Hassell was having a fine game and he almost put Hamilton through in the last minute. 7 minutes from time O'shaughnessy came off and Rutland came on for his 2nd game of the season. In the last few minutes he showed some nice touches. This was a fine result and the team are to be congratulated for playing without the assistance of their manager who was unable to attend owing to work.

HILLFOOT CRUSHED

Institute 8 Hillfoot 0

The first year team turned in one of their best performances of the season on Saturday, easily beating a rather weak Hillfoot team. Institute moved straight into the attack and in the second minute took the lead when Flanagan accepted a simple chance following a bad mistake by the Hillfoot goalkeeper. Institute were well on top but were unable to increase their lead until the twentieth minute when a long throw by Jamieson was headed on over the goalkeepers head by Jones. Five minutes later it was 3-0 when a shot by Eyo struck the post and rebounded to Flanagan who slotted the ball home.

The second half started with Institute still in control and Jamieson scored with a long range effort after only three minutes. A fifth goal soon followed when Eyo forced home following a good run by Flanagan. Long made it six when the ball rebounded to him from the Hillfoot defense. Hillfoot made occasional raids but rarely threatened the Institute goal. Ten minutes from time however their left winger moved into the Institute penalty area and unleashed a powerful shot which seemed certain to go in the top corner when Rooke dived across and turned the ball round the post. Institute then returned to the attack and Flanagan scored number seven following a cross by Bailey. Two minutes from time Flanagan scored his 22nd. goal of the season when he squeezed the ball home from a very narrow angle.

CAN YOU COPE? Are you able to think straight even when under pressure? Try this simple quiz below. All you have to do is read through the paragraph following the instructions as you go along. Your time limit is 5 MINUTES. If you cheat and allow yourself longer then your score is not valid. A good score would strongly hint that your mind can take it when it comes to complications under time pressure. Of a sample of people tested the highest 10 per cent scored 19 or higher, while the next 20 per cent made from 14 to 15 points. The next 30 per cent scored 12 to 13. Count your correct answers and see which group you fit into. Less than 12 correct shows that you may tend to become unduly confused in unfamiliar situations requiring rapid brainwork.

Remember - time limit 5 minutes.

If the letter Z appears anywhere before this comma, cross it out - otherwise cross it out in this word: ZOO.
