EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE FOOTBALL BRINGS CUP VICTORY

Institute 3 St. Margarets 0

There was an air of inevitability about our victory against St. Margarets in the second round of the Martindale Cup. The team played in a most professional manner and only in the first ten minutes of the second half was there any real doubt about the final outcome. Langford was back in the team, lining up at centre forward. The first goal chance was from Phillipson who shot narrowly wide after 5 minutes. Langford now turned well with the ball and again Institute came close to opening the scoring. With Regan running well in midfield and the defence looking very organised the game settled into a pattern of Institute dominance. Chellew was making his mark with some strong runs at the St. Margarets defence and from one long run he spooned his shot over the bar. O'shaughnessy and Johnson had worked out a fine understanding and with Freckleton in his usual consistent form and Halewood continuing his fine form of recent weeks St Margarets had little opportunity to test Naughton. One occasion when our defence was caught 'napping' Naughton made an excellent save to deny St Margarets a goal. Bennett, after a quiet start came into the game with two dangerous 'runs' down the right wing. He crossed the ball well and St. Margarets were a little lucky to scramble the ball away. Institute had a bad scare after 20 minutes when a free kick for the opponents was 'banged' against our crossbar, our defensive wall obviously not doing its job.

HAMILTONS FINE GOAL.

After 25 minutes Institute took the lead. Regan sent a superb through ball past five defenders and Hamilton collected the ball and slipped it past the advancing goalkeeper. This was a deserved lead and we came close to increasing it when first Phillipson and then Regan came close with good shots.

The second half started with St Margarets taking control and if they could have scored in this period the game might have ended very much different. Our defence was caught out several times, mainly because of poor marking. This allowed the St. Margarets forwards to find space but they were denied the important equaliser. As we emerged from this bad spell some dangerous counterattacks stretched the St. M defence. From one such attack Regan carried the ball a full 40 yards before setting up an almighty goalmouth scramble that saw Hamilton and Bennett come close. Langford broke clear but missed his attempted lob. After 20 minutes Institute delivered the killer punch. A corner from the right came over and it looked a certainty that Chellew would score. However he took a lot of time getting the ball under control. The ball broke to Langford who also took far too much time before banging it past the helpless goalkeeper.

LANGFORD 'SEALS IT UP'

After Naughton had made a fine save and Phillipson finished off his fine work with a vital clearance Langford Bennett and Chellew showed up in attack. After 25 minutes Langford scored his second goal. Hamilton picked up a good pass that allowed him to run past a defender. He crossed the ball and Langford was in the perfect position to hit a shot past the helpless goalkeeper. This was a just reward for Langford for he had never ceased to put the St M defence under pressure. By now Phillipson was having trouble with his shorts and St Margarets heads were right down. The whistle went giving Institute a 3-0 win.
