## FLANAGAN SCORES 4 IN FINE VICTORY

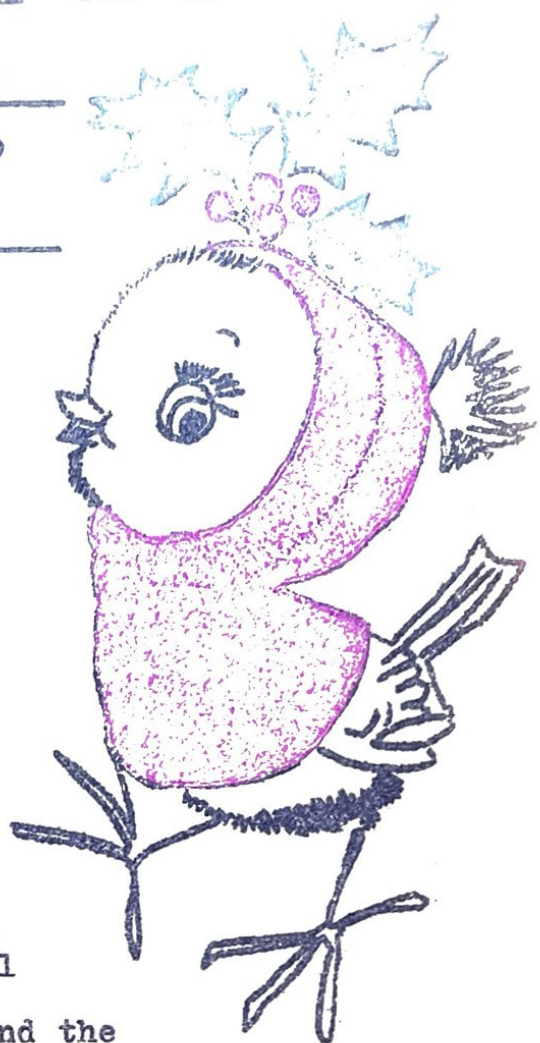
JONES, LONG AND PARRY  
ALSO SCORE.

Warwick Bolam 1 Institute 7

Institute kicked off with ten players and right from the start had most of the play. 3 successive corners caused little trouble to Warwick and shortly after Long should have scored, his shot rebounding to Flanagan who shot wide. Lintott cleared his 'line' well on two occasions getting really stuck in. After 7 minutes Parry played a great dummy and the resulting shot gained Institute yet another corner. With Jamieson worrying Warwick with his long throws it looked as if Institute were going to score many goals when disaster struck. Lintott undid his previous good work by giving the ball away in defence and this allowed Warwick a clear shot at goal. Maybe Rooke was 'put off' by spectators, but his effort at stopping the shot was very poor. He decided to kick the ball clear and it rolled under his leg into the net. This whole incident was typical of much of Institute's defensive play. All defenses make mistakes, some teams do not pay for their mistakes as much as others. Whenever we made a 'boob' it always seemed to be in a position of real danger. Indeed if Warwick Bolam had not been such poor finishers they could easily have scored six or seven goals. They didn't and we did. But that is jumping ahead so back to the 15th minute. Dudley went on the first of several 'dashes' down the wing but ran out of space and a goal kick resulted. Now it was Jamieson who broke up a Warwick attack but our main problem at this stage was getting the ball through to Flanagan. Warwick pulled off some timely interceptions. It was possible that the 25th minute saw a turning point in this game. Warwick Bolam missed an absolute sitter. Credit to Rooke for making the ultimate save but he should never have been given a chance. In the next minute Warwick missed another 'gift' kindly presented by Jamieson who blundered right in front of goal. Rooke again saved well when he should really have been 'fishing' the ball out of the back of the net. Had Warwick scored two goals at this stage who knows what would have happened. Happily they missed and the action continued. To really test the nerves of the large crowd (nine) Mr Mockler Mr Cooke Mr Jones, Mr Flanagan and Mr Carter & 4 WB supporters the Institute defence got into another rare old tangle. Now it was Lintott who made a terrible mistake and WB missed yet another sitter.

Flanagan firing of waiting for passer to reach him now collected the ball and beat four men before he lost it five yards out. Jamieson had a good shot from 15 yards and again Flanagan came close with a lob from ten yards. Mr Mockler and I were just discussing second half tactics when the 'tide' turned and Institute commenced the goal deluge that hit WB. A Jones corner did not reach the goalmouth but the ball was not cleared and eventually Jones volleyed the ball home. One minute later a long Jamieson throw was headed on by Jones and Flanagan, although not connecting with any real power, headed the ball wide of the goalkeeper. At half time the score was 2-1.

### FLANAGAN COMPLETES HIS HAT TRICK.

Rooke saved his side in the 2nd minute when he saved well after Wright had slipped up. Dudley went on the first of about three hundred runs in the second half. His shot nearly hit the school roof. Flanagan received the ball twenty yards out and from a position of little danger to WB cracked home a great goal. Minutes later our leading scorer again picked the ball up thirty yards or so out and moved down the left flank. He took the ball wide, brought it back and 'slammed' the leather past the unfortunate WB goalkeeper. Flanagan has an uncanny ability to shrug off opponents. His close control is excellent. Many times he appears to have lost his opportunity and yet seconds later the ball is in the back of the net. He certainly knows where the goal is and he is a very useful player indeed. Long had his chance now with a free kick and he placed his shot right in the corner. The goalkeeper saved well but the ball dropped down to Parry who scored number 5. Wright headed clear at the other end but it was all Institute now. Dudley 'buzzed' down the left again and sent over what would have been a perfect rugby conversion. Carter sent through a superb pass to Lintott who was partly tripped in the area. Had Lintott performed one of his games period 'oscar' winning dives a penalty would have been a certainty. He recovered and centred the ball. Long blasted over from 5 yards.

Now the game took another mysterious turn. For ten minutes WB attacked and all our defensive failings returned. They missed another 3 or 4 sitters. How they missed one chance I shall never know. I think Rooke had someone up above looking after his goal. Carter pulled off one fine interception and gradually WB's phase of attacking faded. First Dudley dashed down the wing then was nowhere and WB missed their last chance. There were several offside situations but the Ref to be fair did not blow for either side. Flanagan returned to the action and headed the ball to Tony Jones whose shot hit the bar. Long put the rebound away very well. Lintott was good in the air but tended to look a little clumsy on the 'deck'. Near the end Flanagan broke clear again and the goalkeeper must have despaired as he saw his shot beaming in on goal. Number 7 and a well deserved 4th goal for Flanagan. A very enjoyable game compensated the editor for missing out on a 4th year goal feast.

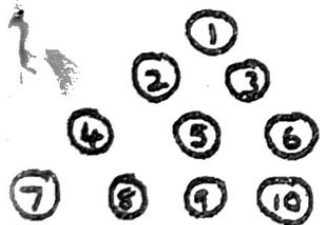

This game took place on a firm pitch which meant that good football could be played, AND it was L.I.H.S. began with McHUGH in goal because WILKINSON arrived a couple of minutes late. Nothing much happened in the first few minutes bar a couple of attempted breaks down both flanks by both teams. WILKINSON took his place in goal and McHUGH reverted back to his usual right-back position. The W. 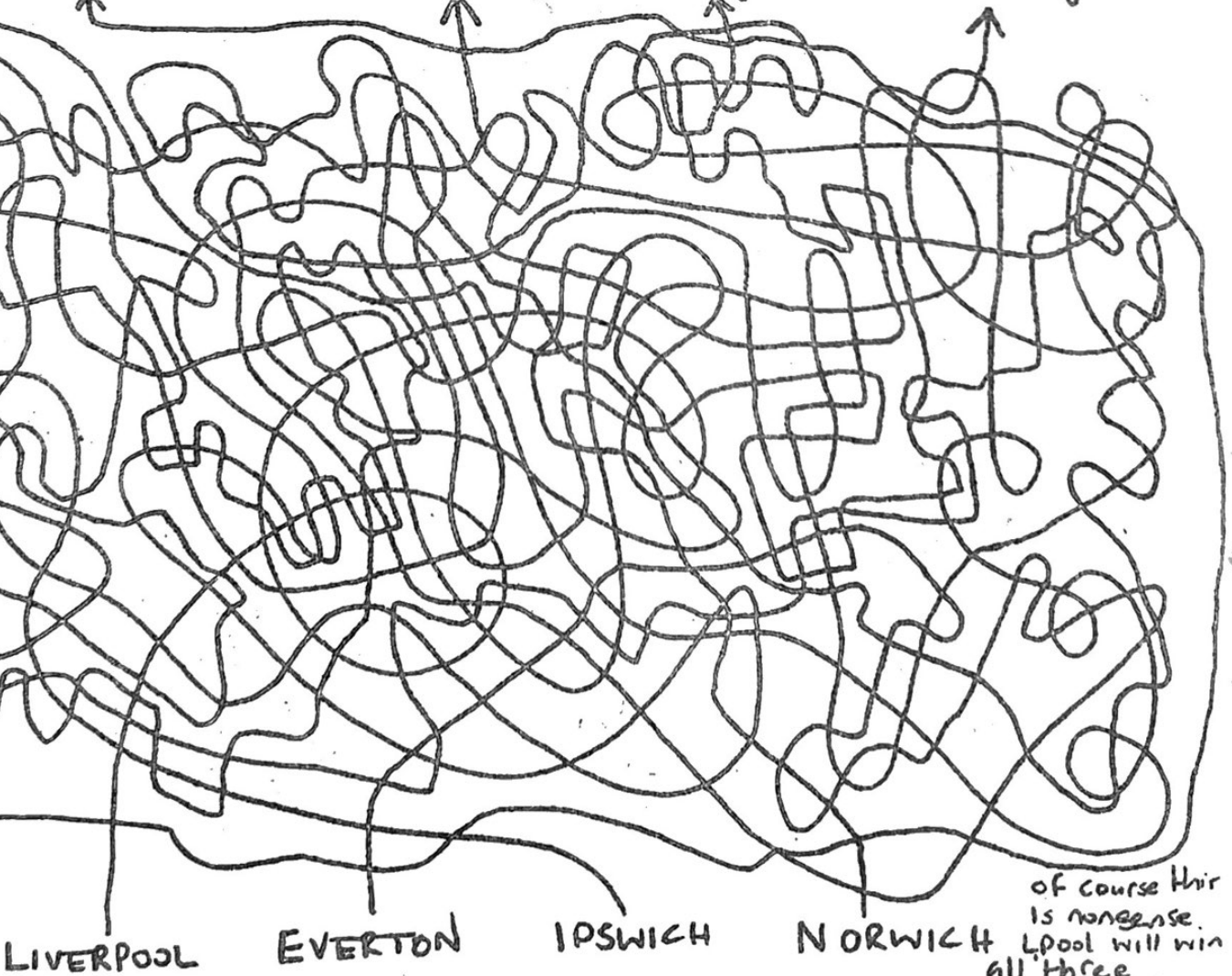

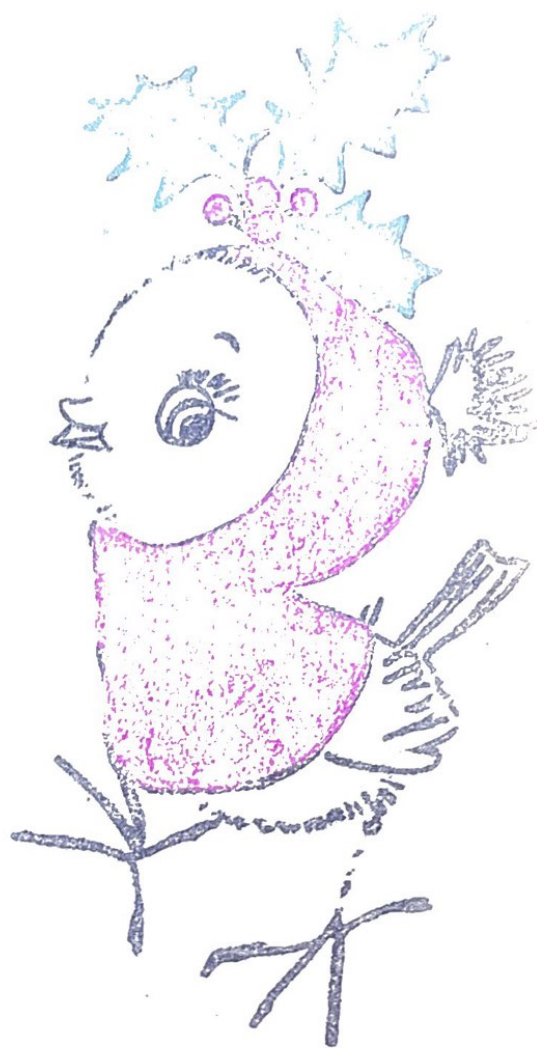

Langford then left the field to complete his Xmas shopping and was replaced by another deadly striker, Freckleton. However Freckleton was not quite on form he only scored 14 goals before half time. One of his goals was a ninety yard run in which he beat fifteen players ( @ twice) before hammering the ball home. His shot was so powerful that it burst the net and carried on into a nearby housing estate, breaking two windows and ending up in a council house lounge. At half time the manager tied all his players' laces together to try and even up the sides but this did not work. O'shaughnessy now started to bamboozle WB by somersaulting onto his hands and scored 11 goals with deft flicks of his head and shoulders. The ref blew up 29 minutes early and a hard game came to an end.
