unmarked(see diagram above). Shortly after a brilliant glancing header from Halewood hit the crossbar and bounced down. WEST DERBY LUCKY WINNERS.

Institute 1 West Derby 3.

The Second Year Team were unfortunate not to gain at least a draw in their match with Cup Semi-Finalists West Derby on Saturday but after gaining a well deserved half time lead a combination of injury and mistakes (defensive and refereeing) led to a 3-1 defeat.

West Derby opened strongly but Institute gradually settled down and took control of the game. Eyo gave Institute the lead after 10 minutes when he cracked a tremendous shot into the net from a narrow angle following a long throw into the penalty area by Jamieson. Institute threatened to score a second goal several times and Rooke was only troubled once when he did well to turn a close range shot around the post.

The second half began with Institute still looking the more likely to score but after 10 minutes West Derby equalised. Lintott who had been playing very well was caught out of position and a through ball found a West Derby forward just on side and Rooke was given no chance. Institute went forward again and Flanagan had a chance but the goalkeeper came out quickly to smother his shot. Carter worked his way into the area and his shot which seemed goal bound was stopped by Flanagan as he attempted to knock it on over the line. Shortly afterwards occurred two injuries which may have cost Institute the game. First Rooke took a bad knock on the ear as he took the ball bravely off a forward's foot and then Lintott received an ankle injury causing the defence to be reshuffled.

West Derby took the lead when following an Institute throw near their own corner flag, the ball came loose to an unmarked West Derby forward in the area. His shot was rather weak but Rooke still feeling his injury allowed the ball to pass under his diving body. A third West Derby goal came when the referee, (who must have been watching the 7th Bluecoat goal being scored on another pitch) allowed a forward to continue when several yards offside.

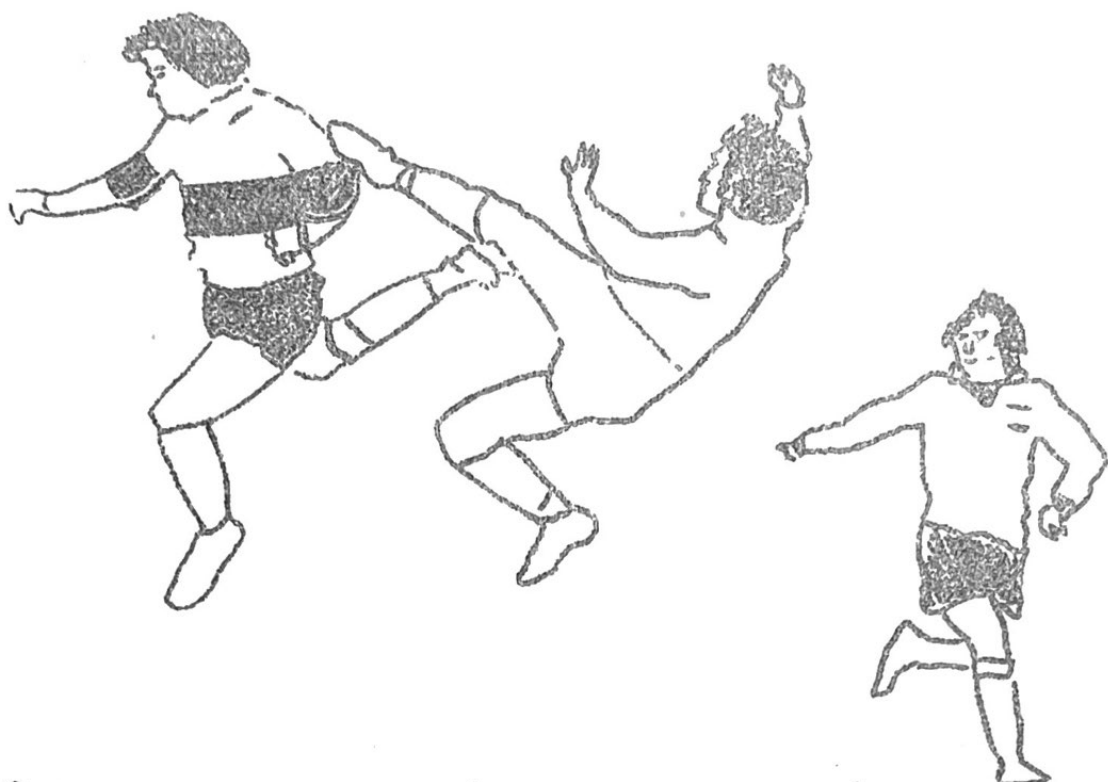
A disappointing result but a good team performance, particularly in the first half, against a team who haven't been beaten by a Liverpool school this year.
