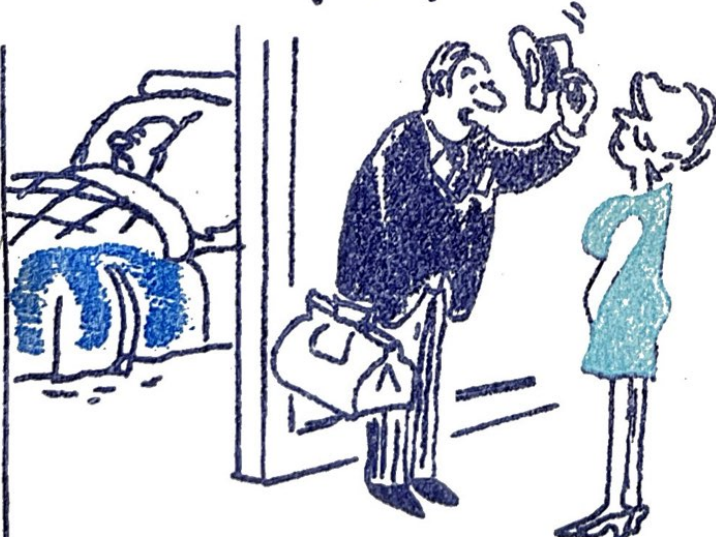

TEN MEN GO DOWN FIGHTING

INSTITUTE 4 NETHERLEY 6

The second year team (10 of them) together with their senior and junior supporters again braved the wet weather on Saturday but despite a great fight, they were unable to overcome their numerical disadvantage. Following the non-appearance of full backs Wright and Dudley the team had to be reshuffled. Long moved to right back, where he had an excellent game and Eyo played left back in the first half. McLoughlin came in at centre forward for his first full game.

Despite being a man short Institute played well for the first twenty minutes and Netherley were rarely in the game. Jamieson caused the Netherley defence trouble on two or three occasions with long throws into the goalmouth but it was a quickly taken short throw to Eyo which produced the first goal when he chipped the ball over the goalkeepers head and just under the bar. Gradually Netherley began to make their extra man count and in a fifteen minute period before and after half time they scored five times and would have had another but for an excellent save by Rooke. With ten men Institute 5-1 down and twenty five minutes still to go, it seemed the score might reach double figures. Many teams would have given up but not this one and with Jones moving to left back to allow Eyo to move forward Institute completely dominated the rest of the match. Flanagan made it 5-2 when he fired home through a packed goalmouth following a corner by Eyo. Soon afterwards it was 5-3 when a mix up in the Netherley defence resulted in an own goal. Long almost scored a fourth Institute goal when he chipped the ball over the goalkeepers head but the ball hit the top of the bar and bounced over. A cross by Flanagan was turned towards the goal by McLoughlin but the goalkeeper just happened to be in the right place to collect. A shot by Carter was deflected but again the goalkeeper managed to save. Five minutes from the end Flanagan made it 5-4 when he scrambled the ball home after McLoughlin's shot rebounded from the crossbar. With Institute going all out for an equaliser which was the least they deserved, Netherley broke away in the last minute to score a sixth goal.

Team; Rooke, Long, Eyo, Carter, Jamieson, Lintott, Parry, Jones, McLoughlin, Flanagan. As Dudley and Wright did not appear in school on Monday it seems probable that they had a good reason for missing Saturdays match. If this does not prove to be the case they will be suspended for one match.

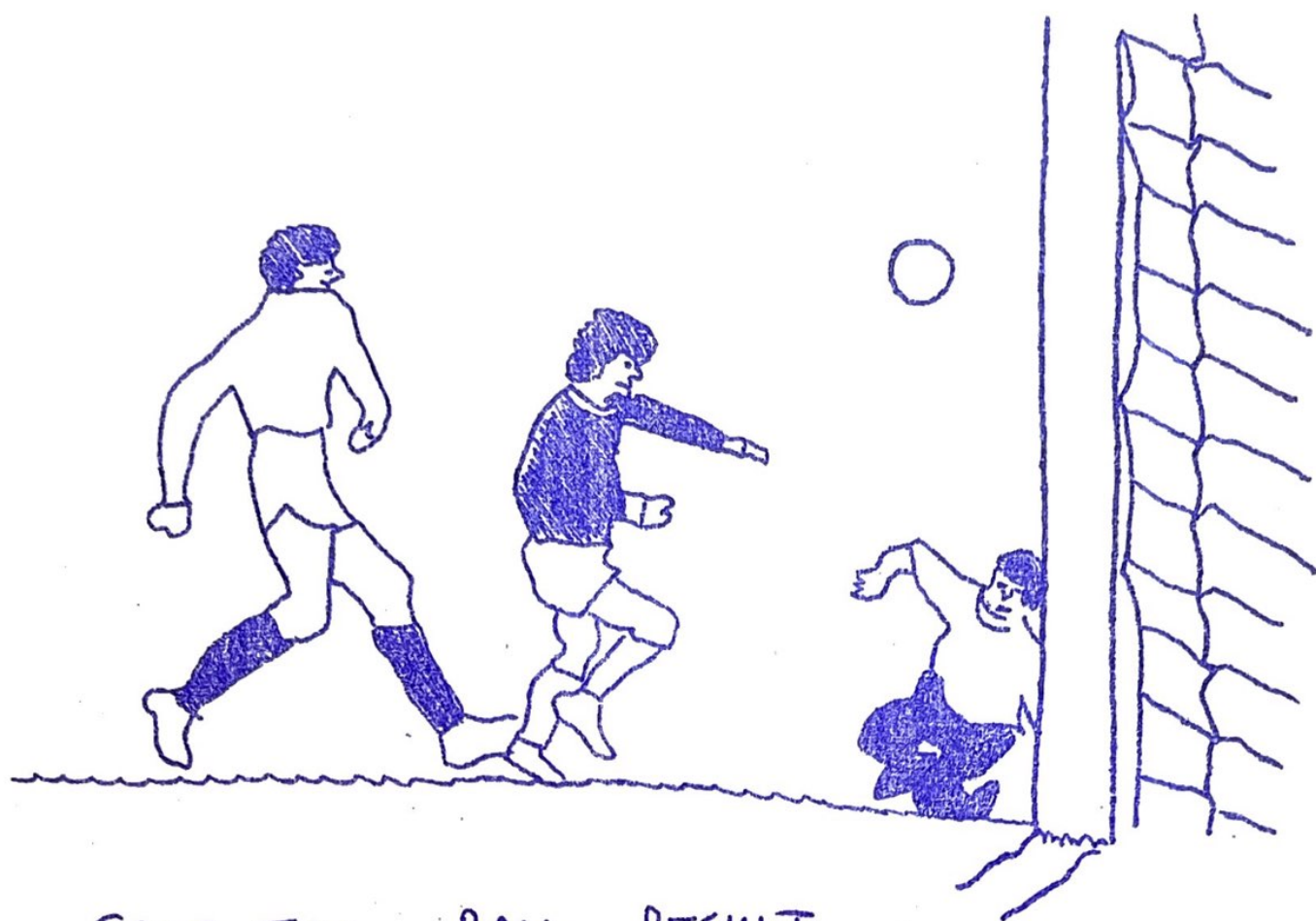
