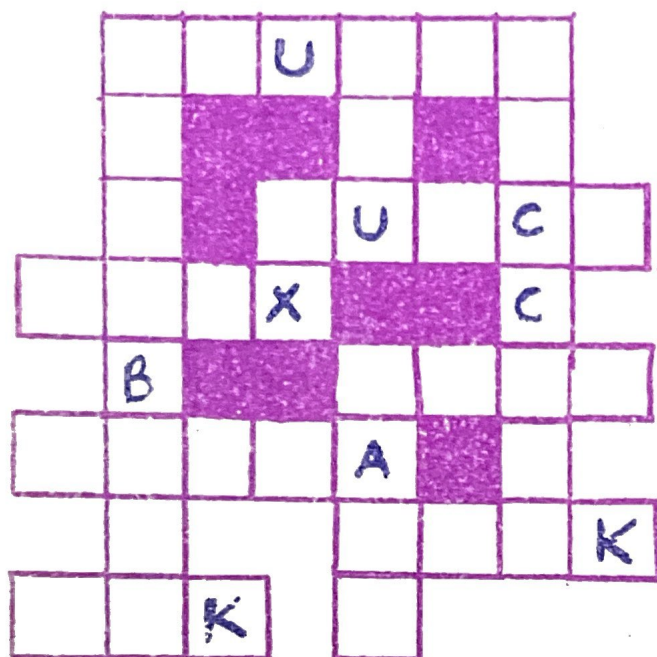
The letters in this square make the names of eight objects all beginning with the letter M. In this case all are articles used for food.
