SECOND YEAR RETURN TO WINNING WAYS. EYO SCORES WINNER IN HARD FOUGHT GAME.

The first half ended with a 1-0 scoreline.

The weather conditions were unpleasant with occasional heavy showers. This did not prevent Institute from starting the game in promising style. Hassell was setting up many attacks from midfield and with Netherley opting for a dangerous offside tactic it looked as if many goals were coming in this game. Madgin started the goal rush when he kept his head as the goalkeeper advanced. The ball was neatly placed into the net. Shortly after the ball was not cleared and Diable scored an easy goal. Warburton was playing well on the right flank and this overall superiority resulted in goal number three when Diable crossed and Madgin headed an excellent goal. Diable scored his second with a close range shot and was denied a first half hat trick by the underneath of the crossbar.

In the second half the ball was hardly out of the Netherley penalty area. Madgin broke clear to complete his hat trick and was immediately followed by Diable who scored a brilliant goal curving his shot round the goalkeeper. There were two entries for this puzzle . If you remember you had to find as many words as possible from the word Thumbprint.

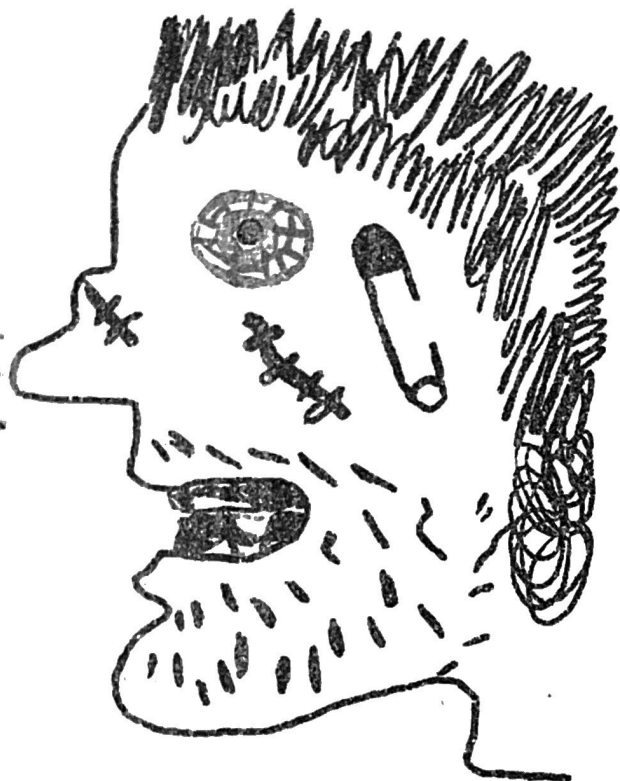
Tyson handed in a list of 97. One or two were doubtful but this was an excellent effort.
