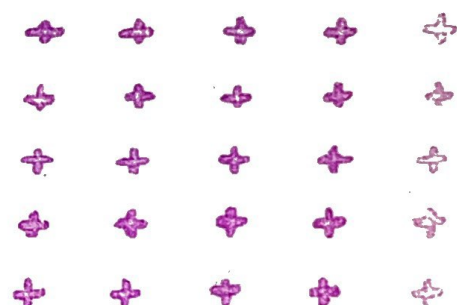

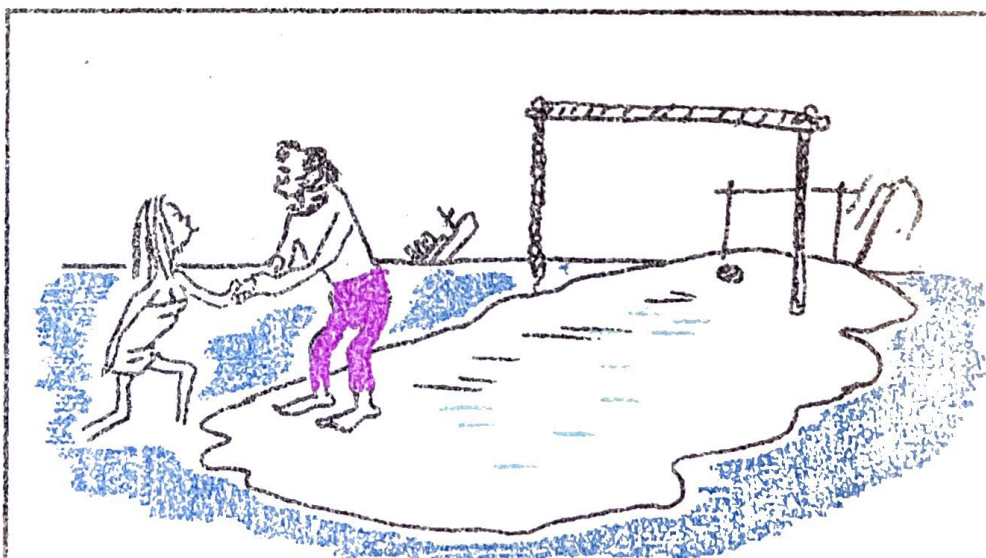

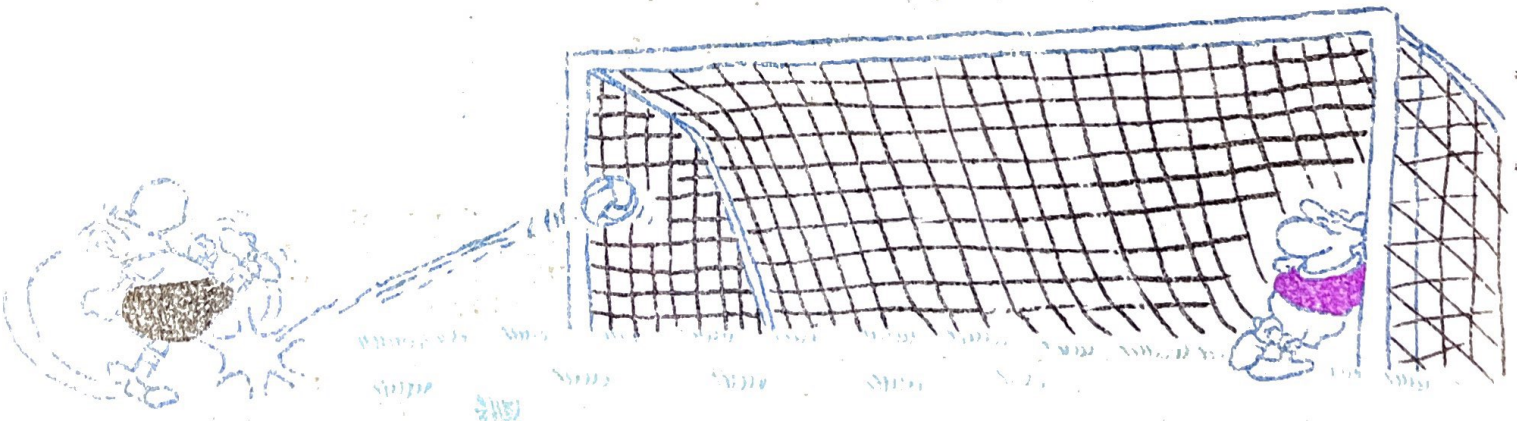


"Do you play football?"

Institute suffered an immediate blow when they had to bring on their substitute in the second second. 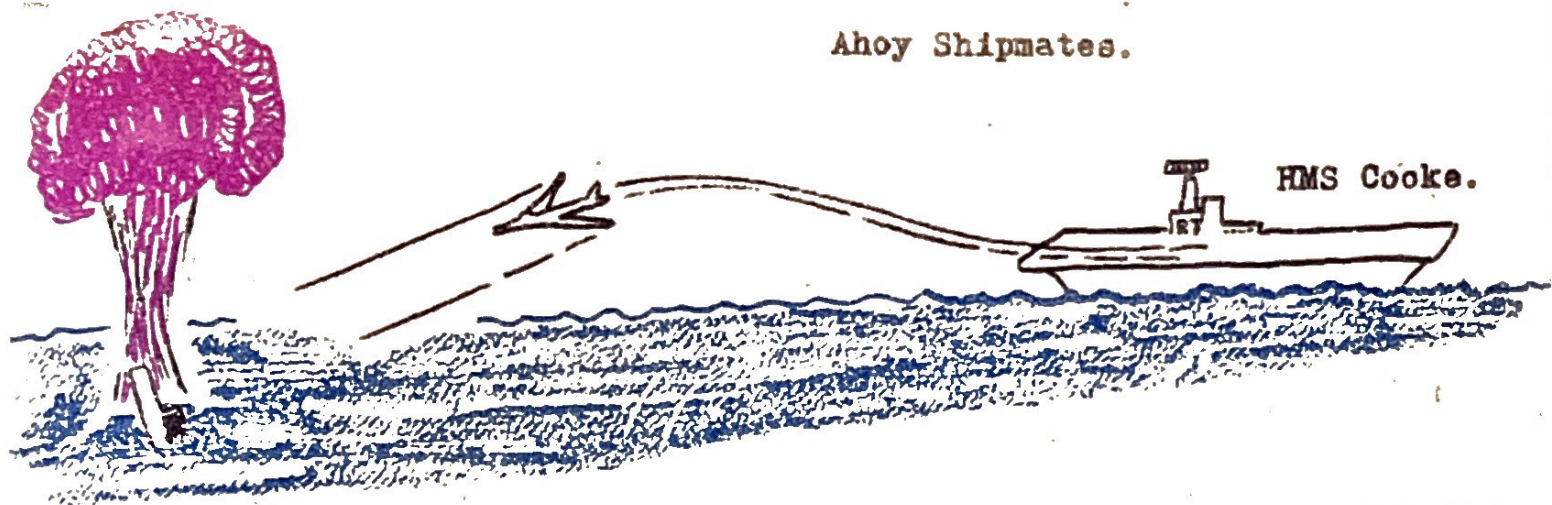
