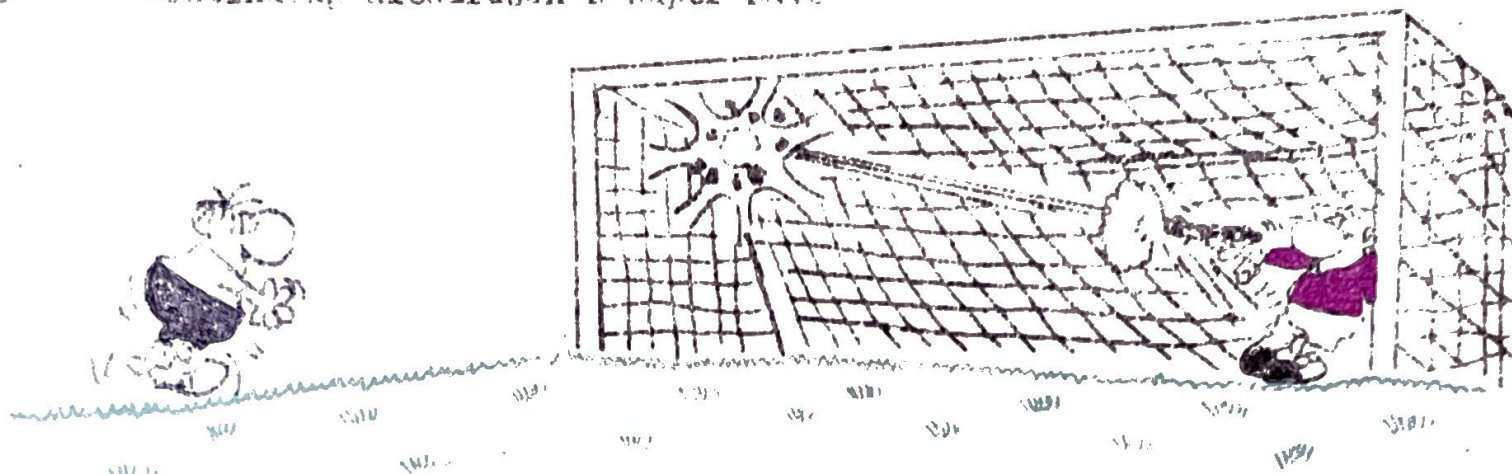

New Heys 5 Institute 5

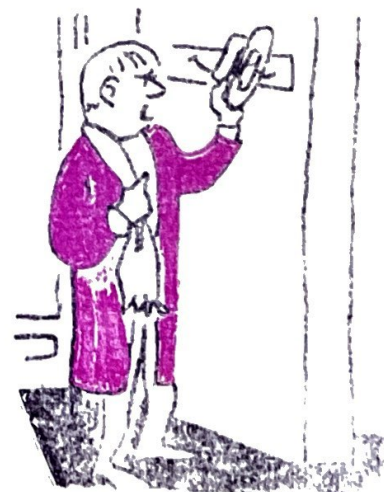

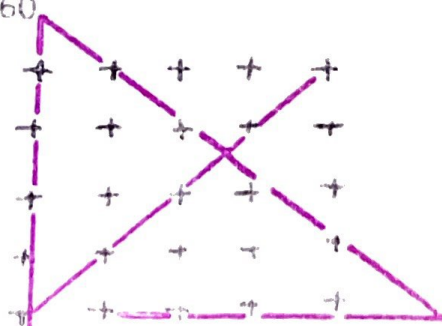

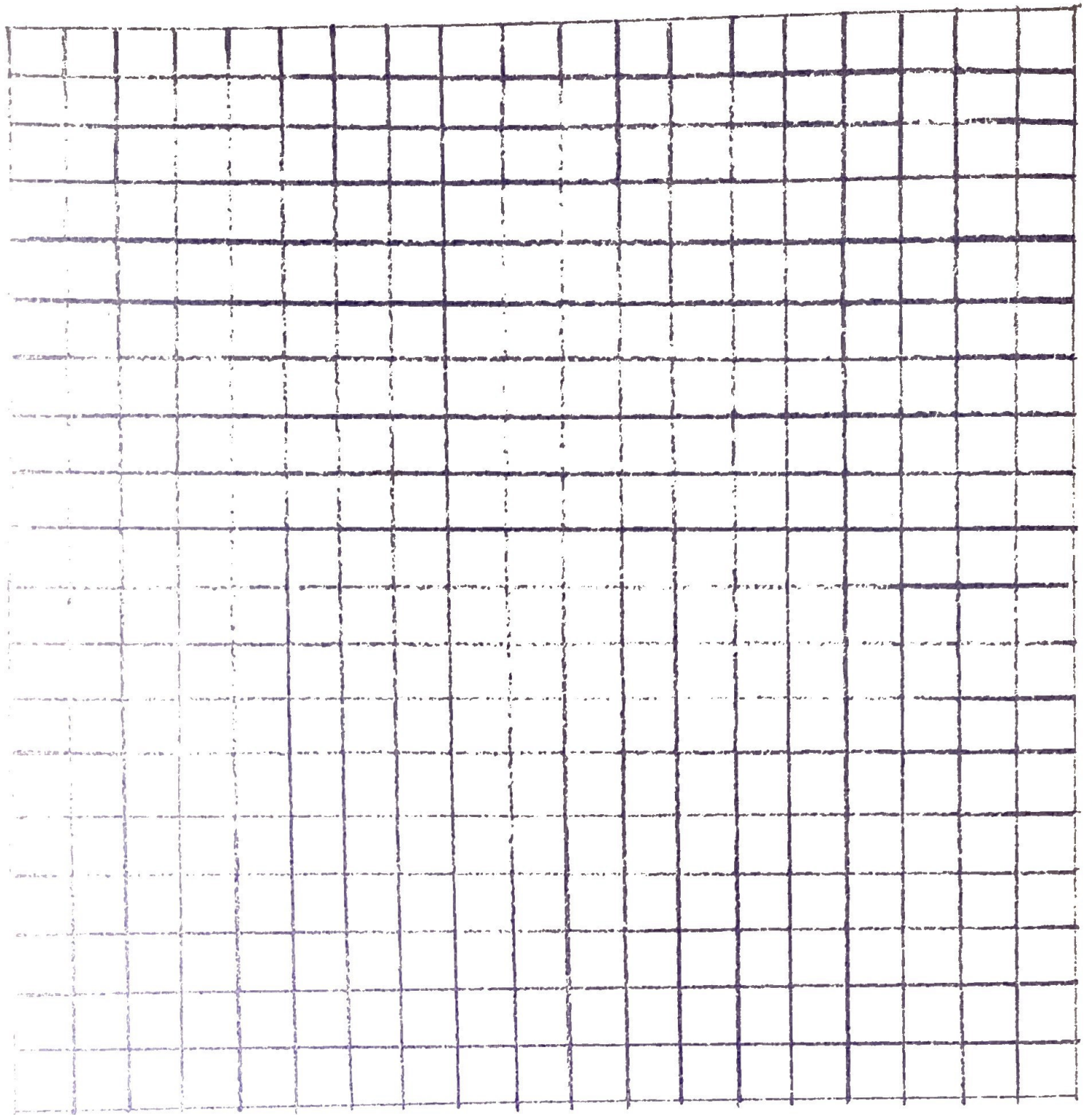

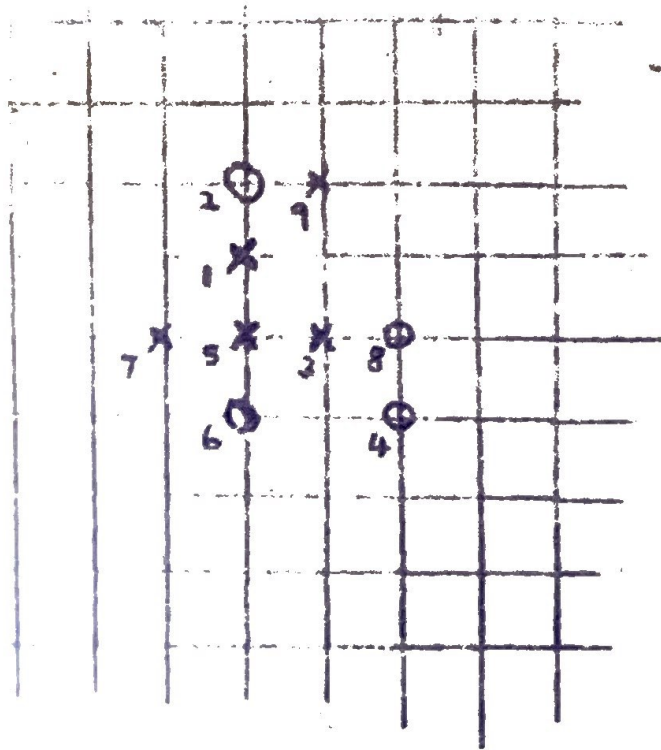

GO? MOKU A game for fun to keep you busy in free periods.

Everyone must at some time have enjoyed a game of noughts and crosses. Here is something of the kind , only much more absorbing. Go Moku is played on a frame consisting of nineteen lines , both vertically and horizontally. In my diagram I show only a corner of the frame. As will be seen the noughts and crosses are not put in the squares as they are in an ordinary game of O's and X's but on the intersections of the lines. "Cross" starts by making his mark on any intersection and then nought follows. And they do this alternately until someone wins or the game is blocked. The thing aimed at is to get 5 crosses or 5 noughts in a line counting vertically, horizontally or diagonally . I have started a game in my diagram to show you exactly how it proceeds. Actually cross tries to win and nought contents himself with checking him , more than in endeavouring to win himself , though he is entitled to win , if he can.

Of course the two players take it in turns to be cross and therefore start. This is a great game once you have mastered the rules. Try it with your mate. Have a series of games. Enjoy yourself.
